Sign-In/Introductions

Items from Last Meeting

- 1. Assessment of public event venues for accessibility & define minimum standards
 David provided info on current venues and their accessibility:
 - a) Bardstown Road most buildings not accessible
 - b) Iroquois Park some level mixed use seating, steep ramp, can be slick
 - c) Nulu somewhat accessible, many businesses still have a step to get in
 - d) Louisville Palace used to have integrated seating but now has steep ramp and limited accessible seating in back
 - e) Businesses with ramps can often impede walkways
 - f) Music Festivals rough topography, gravel, mud, no shade
 - g) Discussed doing an Accessibility Study with Waterfront & Olmstead Parks

2. Preliminary Review of Vision Zero dashboard to assess high injury areas & causes of accidents (lighting, crosswalks, other)

- a) Will review Dashboard next month as a group so we can use larger screen
- b) David attends Vision Zero meetings
- c) Need to look at data to narrow down areas of focus
- d) Possible focus on pedestrians, lighting, and crosswalks
